THE CONSERVATION COLLECTIVE'S GLOBAL GATHERING IN CORFU



Every year, members of the Conservation Collective's global network meet to learn new skills, exchange best practices and form new synergies. Happily, this year's gathering took place in Corfu, co-hosted by the Ionian Environment Foundation. An integral part of the gathering was conducting site visits to some of our local projects. The team had the opportunity to visit and hear from SIN. PRAXI – Sinies Community Project, Erimiti Plous and Corfu Butterfly Conservation to learn more about their efforts to protect and preserve the precious and threatened biodiversity of the island.

On the final evening we hosted a prize giving event, presented by the IEF's ambassador, Lee Durrell, to recognise and celebrate the work of the foundations from around the world. IEF WINNERS AT THE COLLECTIVES AWARDS 2023



We are proud to announce that, in the category of Fundraising, the **IEF Villa Alliance** was this year's Collectives Awards Winner!

The Collectives Awards consist of an annual celebration of local achievement and project impact throughout our global network, the Conservation Collective (CC). Awards in <u>6 different categories</u> were given out, with winning projects creating a much needed impact on the conservation and regeneration of local ecosystems across our global network. Projects were assessed by the CC's Global Advisory Panel for their potential for replicability, scalability, the urgency of the issues being addressed and the impact created by the grant.

The IEF hopes to see the Villa Alliance model replicated across our sister foundations within the Conservation Collective for global impact!

EVENT ON PAXOS




The second IEF Villa Alliance knowledge sharing event took place in May on Paxos. Joined by villa managers, gardeners, cooks and owners, we shared advice and resources for water conservation, planting for butterflies and the importance of sourcing locally grown ingredients for cooking. A local chef gave a live cooking demonstration to show how delicious the Blue Crab is - an invasive species that, if

demanded enough and taken out of the marine food chain, will have a reduced negative impact on the lonian marine environment. Our rationale continues to be that if villas can make small changes in the way that they operate, demonstrating a care and concern for conservation, then these actions will trickle down into the whole community...small actions, big waves!

INTRODUCING REGENERATIVE FARMING PRACTICES ON PAXOS: THE SOUTHERN LIGHTS



The IEF is very excited to announce our new collaboration and support with NGO, <u>The Southern Lights - Το Νότιο Σέλας</u> - a team who, realising the potential of farming operations to restore soil health, plant health and the health of the overall eco-system, is working hard to promote regenerative farming practices across Greece.

More specifically for the Ionian, this project aims to consolidate a learning group of farmers on the island of Paxos around regenerative farming where a team of experts will facilitate their learning process, discussions and practices around regenerative farming possibilities on the island. In time, such knowledge and practices could see agro-tourism developed on the island, where the opportunities for engaging visitors in local, organically grown-island produce are boundless...Read more about this project HERE.

OCEAN'S EDUCATION IN REMOTE IONIAN ISLANDS



We are excited to announce our new collaboration with the programme: Τα μυστικά του Ωκεανού - Εκπαίδευση Ωκεανού / Ocean's Secrets - educational, experiential lessons to primary school children on remote Ionian Islands. The motivation to carry out these actions in hard-to-reach schools is to give these children the opportunity to have access to a special extracurricular activity that will enrich their school program in the context of developing skills as active citizens of the world ensuring they feel included in the discourse of marine conservation - and that they have opportunities to act within it!

SUSTAINABILITY IN SAILING INFORMATION PACKS



The IEF has supported the creation of an information pack for charter boat users that draws together the advice and resources created by many of our grantees working in marine conservation. The Sustainable Sailing Pack contains information on the Greek marine fauna and flora, how to avoid negative impacts when boating, responsible practices on board and on shore, and how tourists can support conservation

efforts, for example by reporting sightings of mammals to the relevant organisations. Our hope is that this resource will help to engage and inform those chartering sailing boats on the unique and fragile Ionian environment that they have come to explore and enjoy.

KOSAMARE: PROMOTING DIALOGUE BETWEEN SCIENTISTS, ARTISTS AND COMMUNITY ABOUT POSIDONIA



RESIDENCY 2023

The residency aims to create dialogue between scientists, artists and the local community, demonstrating the vitality of the Ionian Sea. Artists will engage with the ecology, history and mythology of Posidonia seagrass meadows, which are a critical habitat of the marine environment.

We are happy to be supporting the Social Cooperative Enterprise group, Kosamare based in Kafalonia. They are a team of professional divers and biologists with a range of technical skills and experience and a unique ability to access and study the Ionian marine environment. Part of their mission is to raise awareness and understanding about the habitats and species they study. In this project, artists will present engaging displays to the public and Kosamare staff will deliver educational presentations on the marine environment and the specific habitat of *Posidonia oceanica* meadows. Children will then be invited to create their own artworks that will be incorporated in the final exhibition, which will be launched ahead of the Environment Festival of Kefalonia in August/September.

CURRENT PROJECT UPDATES

THE SAVE ERIMITIS CAMPAIGN



The IEF continues to support the action group Erimitis Plous and the <u>Save Erimitis Campaign</u>. Our latest efforts have involved funding the creation of a series of short audio visual films and a 6 minute documentary that have been widely circulated to dramatically illustrate the over-development of coastal regions of Corfu in stark contrast to the, as yet, untouched natural beauty of the Erimitis region. In addition we have funded the creation of information boards and leaflets to both map and identify the array of biodiversity and areas of interest for walkers, birdwatchers and butterfly enthusiasts wishing to explore the area.


SINPRAXI RECYCLING GREEN CORNER


IEF AND CORFU BUTTERFLY CONSERVATION COLLABORATE ON A NEW POSTER

ARCHIPELAGOS MONK SEAL FOOTAGE!



We are very pleased to share this incredible footage of monk seals in caves of Corfu. It is the first time that the use of caves by monk seals is documented in this area. Documenting monk seal presence in Corfu, the rarest seal species in the world, is a critical process in promoting the safeguarding of their long-term viability in the Ionian as well as their potential re-colonization of the whole Adriatic region. This is a crucial reason why Corfu is such an important island for the conservation of the monk seal. For these reasons it is important that any sightings are reported in as much detail as possible.

Understanding the seals presence in time and space allows us to evaluate more accurately where to concentrate the cameras. Sharing photos or videos may also help to photo-identify the animal(s).

Ionian Dolphin Project have been gathering information from this region for over 30 years to ensure reliable data can better inform our understanding of the endangered common dolphin as well as other dolphins found in the area. They have identified and tracked dolphins of this region over time, observing injuries, recoveries and progress of individuals over 20 plus years.
